Oldham Today

Evidence obtained from The Joseph Rowntree Foundation report on UK Poverty 2024: The essential guide to understanding poverty in the UK & The Oldham Joint Strategic Needs Assessment Framework





Oldham has one of the highest rates of child poverty in the country at 44%, compared to the national average of 29%.



Oldham's percentage of NEET (Not in Employment, Education or Training), 16 to 17-year olds, is higher than regional and national averages at 6.9% compared to 4.7% nationally.



Oldham has the 4th highest rate of young people in treatment services in Greater Manchester for substance misuse with 2.04 per 1,000 almost double the England average of 1.03.



Oldham has a significantly high obesity rate amongst year 6 children at 42.4% compared to national average of 37.8%.



Oldham's teenage conception rate is 20.5%, significantly higher than the national average of 13.1% for England.

AN INTRODUCTION TO MAHDLO

At Mahdlo Youth Zone, we believe that all young people should have the opportunity to discover their passion and their purpose. To find out what they've got and where it could take them. Our Youth Zone is a purpose-built space fizzing with energy and crammed with incredible facilities. It is staffed by skilled and dedicated youth workers who truly believe in young people in the community – helping them see what they could achieve, and giving them the skills, confidence and ambition to go for it. Year in, year out we deliver life-changing support that helps thousands of young people from a diverse range of backgrounds to thrive. It's inspiring. It's empowering. And it works

Open **40 hours a week**, 7-days a week, while schools are closed - that's evenings and weekends, plus all through the school holidays. We offer a **safe and active space for young people to flourish** in their leisure time, where their interests can be nurtured, and they can grow as individuals. This is a charity that the whole community can be proud of, and you can be part of that journey. **Entry is just 50p** each time and annual membership £5 which gives a young person access to over 20 activities per night!

Mahdlo Youth Zone benefits from the guidance, direction and support from colleagues and partners across the OnSide network. It is part of a network of 22 Youth Zones. OnSide's role is to provide ongoing support as the umbrella organisation within a federated structure and to create new Zones, taking our tried and tested model to ever more young people across the country.

19% of care experienced young people in Oldham attended Mahdlo.



WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

We are seeking at this time:

- · Corporate leaders and Community influencers
- · People with business acumen, knowledge, and connections
- · Lived experience in the Oldham community

Previous board/trustee experience is not necessary and we welcome applications from all ages and backgrounds.

Time commitment required

- · 6 Board meetings a year (and preparation)
- · Offer support and perspective on specific areas and issues by joining Board subcommittees or task & finish groups, as required
- · Represent Mahdlo Youth Zone within the community including at events
- · Once or twice a year, getting to know our young people by joining them on a session.

How will you support me?

- · We provide training to all our board members on safeguarding and governance alongside a comprehensive induction.
- · Each member also receives a Trustee's handbook which includes all our policies, values and guidance.
- · Opportunity for one-to-one meetings to support skill development, if required.
- · Chance to join in sessions with the young people, to better understand our values, mission and work.

What is it like?

The Charity Commission, which regulates charities in England and Wales, says: "Charity trustees are the people who serve on the governing body of a charity. They may be known as trustees, directors, board members, governors or committee members. Charity trustees are responsible for the general control and management of the administration of a charity."
